The Friends of Brooker Creek Preserve Beekeepers Club is open to adults and families who would like to help tend the Friends apiary and learn about beekeeping in a real life format. The club will provide all the tools, equipment, uniforms, training, workshops, and more for members to use. Meetings and workshops are held the last Sunday of each month at 9:00 am. The club meets at the Friends Bee Shed and then heads to the apiary about two miles away to tend the bees. The Club is led by Bob Burkard, a bee hobbyist and apiary expert.

Club membership is free, but each person must have a current membership to the Friends of Brooker Creek Preserve. A special bee club category is offered for bee club members; contact the club for this information.

Not everyone is comfortable working in an apiary with thousands of bees, so the Friends offer a one-time, first-time free trial. Potential members can work with the group without joining for their first time attending, then are expected to join the club if they wish to continue with club beekeeping.
